

Processing Key Stage 1 Results 2024

IMPORTANT - An official communication from The Standards and Testing Agency.

STA <u>emailed you in June 2023</u> to confirm that end of key stage 1 (KS1) assessments are no longer statutory from the academic year 2023 to 2024 onwards.

They did, however, develop and supply materials for optional end of KS1 tests. These will include optional tests of English reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling and mathematics. They will also continue to make the end of KS1 teacher assessment frameworks available for optional use.

The aim of the optional assessments is to give schools access to test papers to assist the measurement of pupil achievement and to help identify where pupils need additional support as they transition into key stage 2. The tests can also be used to inform teacher assessment judgements, using the optional teacher assessment frameworks.

The Government encourages schools to administer the optional tests and teacher assessments, but there is no requirement to use these or report results to parents or local authorities, and they will not be used for school accountability purposes.




Step 1: Ensure you have the Summer 2024 (Version 7.216) or later version of SIMS.net.

Before continuing with this process, you must upgrade your SIMS.net system to **7.216** or higher.

To check which version, you currently have:

- 1. Run SIMS.net.
- 2. On the menu bar click **Help | About SIMS .net**.
- 3. You should be using version **7.216** or higher.



If you are not using the correct version, then contact your local support team.




Step 2: Identify the End of Key Stage 1 Pupils

If all pupils taking the tests are in Year 2 this section can be ignored. Go to Step 3

However, if there are pupils assigned to other year groups taking the tests then a **User-Defined Group** must be created to be used in the Wizard.

Creating a User Defined Group


- 1. Select Focus | Groups | User Defined Groups.
- 2. Go to the **New** button to create a new group.
- 3. Insert a suitable name and code for the group e.g., **KS1 2024**.
- 4. Insert a Short name for the group (KS1 2024)
- 5. Make the group **Active** in the **Active State** box.



- 6. To choose a supervisor click the **Current Main Supervisor** browser after which the 'Manage Group Supervisor' screen appears. Click Action and then Add Supervisor.
- 7. Click Search.
- 8. Choose the appropriate member of staff.
- 9. Make that person the Main Supervisor.
- 10. Add some notes if you wish and click the Save button.
- 11. Move on to the 'Membership' section.
- 12. Click Action and Add Student to add pupils to the group.



13. Choose the Year Group from which you want to select and click **Search.**



- 14. Choose the pupils you require by selecting individuals or in multiples.
- 15. Click **OK**. The names of these pupils will appear in the box below.
- 16. Click Save.
- 17. If there are other pupils who are taking the KS1 assessments but have been allocated to other years, then choose the appropriate year again and pick those children out to add to the **KS1 2024** group.

Step 3: Importing the Assessment Wizard for Key Stage 1


The new routines for importing assessment components as part of the SIMS upgrade process should mean that all statutory assessment wizards have already been created on your system as part of the upgrade to SIMS version 7.216.




Step 4: Using the Key Stage 1 Wizard

- 1. Go to Tools | Performance | Assessment | Wizard Manager.
- 2. If you have imported other Wizards in the past they will appear in the list.




- Leave the filter on Incomplete and highlight the Key Stage you are going to work with Key
 Stage 1 Wizard England 2024 in this case.
- 4. Click Next.
- From the Select Group screen, click the browser (magnifying glass)
 The Group Selector appears (shown below).





Either:

- Click the + next to Year Group and choose Year 2 or
- Click the + next to National Curriculum Year and choose Curriculum Year 2
- Click the + next to User Defined and select the KS1 2024 group that you created earlier (through the User Defined Group routine).
- 6. Click Next.
- 7. A screen like this appears which invites you to choose the **Marksheets** you want to use.




For Key Stage 1 in 2024 there are three Marksheets:

- **KS1 A. Teacher Assessments 2024** This Marksheet can be used to collect and store the Outcome for the KS1 Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science Performance Descriptor of the reformed curriculum (Assessment without Levels) Teacher Assessment.
- **KS1 C. Test Outcomes 2024** This Marksheet can be used to enter results of the reformed curriculum (Assessment without Levels) tests that support the Teacher Assessments.
- **KS1 D. Broadsheet (Review) 2024** This Marksheet can be used to review the Test and Teacher Assessment results of the reformed curriculum (Assessment without Levels) that have been entered. This marksheet is for review purposes only. If you wish to amend any of the data shown in it, please use either Marksheets KS1 A. and/or C. as required and then reload this marksheet.

Marksheet Entry: Key Stage 1 A. Teacher Assessments

- 1. Enter the performance descriptor outcomes for English Reading and Writing, Mathematics and Science.
- 2. Click the Calculate button. The final two columns alert you to any missing entries.



3. Review the outcomes and repeat the process, if necessary.




4. Click the **Save** button. Validation checks are performed for missing result entries and an indication given of the number of missing entries that still require completion.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Pupils who are working below the standard of the Pre-Key Stage in Reading, Writing or Mathematics, or who have not met the expected standard in Science, should be recorded as EM (Engagement Model).

Marksheet Entry: Key Stage 1 C. Test Outcomes

This marksheet can be used to enter results of the new curriculum (Assessment without Levels) tests that supported the Teacher Assessments.



Marksheet Entry: Key Stage 1 D. Broadsheet (Review)

The results displayed in the Broadsheet Review marksheet are separated by coloured spaces, to differentiate between the different teacher assessments and tests.

Step 4 (A)

Results Entry: Teacher Assessments KS1

The Key Stage 1 Teacher Assessments for 2024 consist of:

- English Reading
- English Writing
- Mathematics
- Science.
- From the list of marksheets select KS1 A. Teacher Assessments 2024 by clicking on the Pencil (Edit) button or double clicking the marksheet name.
 Do <u>not</u> click Next at this stage.
- 2. You will then get a Marksheet with your Y2 pupils, or the User Defined Group you created earlier, and columns that relate to the assessments that need to be entered.
- 3. Enter grades for all children in the white columns. If you enter an invalid grade, it will tell you.

There are two grey columns. Both are formula columns.




The first will calculate if any entries are missing and will put 'Fail!' if pupils do not have the full set of grades.


The second will show how many entries are missing for each pupil.

Each of the columns with the label **Key Stage 1 Validated Result** (a Result Set) will contain the results.

4. Regardless of whatever systems schools use to record their internal assessments the following was the statutory requirement for grades to be returned to DfE (No longer required). Staff entering data into these marksheets should refer to teaching staff for advice if there is any confusion as to which grade to assign to a pupil.




Key Stage 1 Teacher Assessments in Science:





5. Screenshot of marksheet KS1 A. Teacher Assessments 2024 below:



- 6. Click **Calculate**. This will check for missing results.
- 7. **Save** these.
- 8. Exit from the Marksheet by clicking on **Close**. This will take you back to the screen from where you originally chose the Marksheet.

Step 4 (B)

Results Entry: Test Outcomes KS1

The recording of Key Stage 1 Test Outcomes is optional. The header notes for this marksheet say:

This Marksheet can be used to enter results of the reformed curriculum (Assessment without Levels) tests that support the Teacher Assessments.

These results are not required by either the DfE or the Local Authority, therefore schools are free to decide if they want to record this information in SIMS. Good practice would suggest that most schools will want to record this information as evidence to support their Teacher Assessment grades. It is also useful information to pass on to a pupil's next school via the Common Transfer File.

Composition of Key Stage 2 Tests

- The tests consist of: English Spelling (20 marks)
- English Grammar, Punctuation and Vocabulary (50 marks)
- = Total Score (70 marks)
- + Scaled Score (999)
- + Outcome (Performance Descriptor). English Reading Paper 1 (50 marks)
- = Scaled Score (999)
- + Outcome (Performance Descriptor)

NOTE: There is no longer a separate test for English Writing.


Step 5: Using the Wizards for Reporting to Parents

Once you are sure all the results have been entered on the Marksheets, reports can be produced. The Wizards will produce:

- KS1 P1 Student England TA 2024 An Individual Report for each pupil showing Teacher Assessments only.
- KS1 P1 Student England TA and TT 2024 An Individual Report for each pupil showing both Teacher Assessments and Test Outcomes
- **KS1 P2 Comparative England 2024** the Comparative Report shows the school's results for year 2024 compared to last year's national results 2024.
- 1. Go to Tools | Performance | Assessment | Wizard Manager
- 2. Select the Key Stage 1 Wizard you require.
- 3. You can leave the Group Selection as it is.
- 4. When presented with the list of Marksheets click Next.

To Print an individual Report for each Pupil

Choose **KS1 P1 Student England TA 2024** this will produce reports for all the pupils ticked in the list below.



However, you will want to see a **Print Preview** of one of the reports first.



Preview

To see a preview:

- Choose Deselect All in the bottom half of the screen, then tick <u>one</u> of the pupils only. Now click the Preview Report button.
- 2. A Microsoft Word document will then show you this pupil's KS1 Teacher Assessments.
- 3. When you have finished the preview close Word and return to the Wizard. If you are asked to save the report, click **NO**.

Print

To print a report:

- 1. If reports for all pupils are required, then choose **Select All**. If not, go through the list and select those that are required by ticking the boxes.
- 2. Click the **Print** button (printer icon). Reports will be created in Word for those children selected.
- 3. Again, do not save the Word document that this process produces.

Upload Report

This will save a copy of each report and link it to the main pupil record for the child. These documents can then be accessed via the **Linked Documents** connection from the individual pupil record in SIMS.

To upload a report:

- 1. Select all the pupils to whom you wish to link their report.
- 2. Click on the **Upload Report** icon.

After a short pause, the documents will be linked to the selected pupils and a confirmation message will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.

General Note on Reporting to Parents:

Schools are not obliged to report test results to parents in an annual report.

However, parents must be allowed access to their child's results on request.
